## Student Services: The ACCENT Centers

ACCENT is an independent study abroad program provider with a multinational team of staff members who all have personal knowledge in study abroad. With more than 20 years of experience coordinating high-quality overseas study programs, ACCENT works in partnership with U.S. colleges and universities to develop academically challenging and culturally enriching overseas study experiences in Paris, Florence, London, Madrid and Rome. Each city is home to a fully staffed ACCENT Study Center that serves as a home base for program participants. The ACCENT San Francisco Center coordinates program enrollment and pre-departure preparation for students, helping to make their transition to living overseas as smooth as possible.

The ACCENT Paris Study Center is located in the historic Bastille district of central Paris, within easy métro/bus reach of the Latin Quarter and the City of Lights' incomparable museums and monuments. The ACCENT Study Center is open during the week for students to use the resource/lending library, computer lab, wireless connectivity and study annex. The ACCENT staff in Paris provides a wide variety of on-site student services and is an invaluable resource for students who want to find out more about their host city.

## Application and Enrollment

The Summer in Paris Program is open to students who are at least 18 years of age at the time of application with a cumulative college GPA of 2.0 and are eligible to enroll in two of the courses being offered. Program space is limited. Students should send the enclosed application with the \$390 non-refundable first payment to ACCENT as soon as possible. Upon receipt of your application and first payment, Glendale Community College and ACCENT will provide you with additional application and enrollment forms. Applications must be received by March 31, 2018. Beyond March 31, limited enrollment is allowed when space permits.

## Transferable Academic Credit

The Summer in Paris Program is offered for transferable college credit through Glendale Community College, an accredited California Community College that will provide a transcript upon request for the coursework completed overseas. Most courses are transferable to the University of California and California State University systems. Please verify the transferability of courses with your advisor or registrar before you apply.

## Academic Curriculum

Courses begin on campus one week prior to departure for Paris. Students must enroll in two 3-unit courses from French 48, Humanities 117 and Music 120 and attend and actively participate in the orientations, classes, and field excursions. Please see the college catalog to make sure you will meet all pre-requisites before the program begins.

**French 48: French International Field Studies (3 units)** focuses on giving students the necessary cultural and language tools to cross the cultural divide and consider their place as global citizens. Students will learn to cultivate a more mindful approach to intercultural communication and will be able to build their basic French language skills in order to navigate the foreign country. Through the exploration of famous French historical and cultural landmarks and encounters with native speakers, the students will have a better understanding of French language and culture. Prerequisite: None / Transfer: CSU elective. Potentially transferable as elective to UC. Transfer institution will assess on a case-by-case basis.

**Humanities 117: Creativity, Culture, and Society (3 units)** is an interdisciplinary course focusing on literature, drama, dance, and film. The course recognizes that individual art works and art forms are components of larger cultural patterns. As students consider works from various cultures and times, they read, discuss, and write critically about the interaction between artists, societies, and works of art. Prerequisite: Eligibility for English 101 / Transfer: CSU, UC and potentially USC (will assess course syllabus first)

**Music 120: Music Appreciation (3 units)** traces the evolution of music over the past 1500 years, with a special emphasis on understanding how to listen for greater enjoyment. Students learn the basic elements of music, such as form and structure, families and subgroups of musical instruments, as well as learning about specific composers and works. As part of this class, students will be required to attend one or more classical concerts and submit written reports. Prerequisite: None / Transfer credit: CSU, UC, USC

Note: This course is designed especially for non-music majors and may not be taken for credit by students who have completed Music 125 or Music 126.

## Program Faculty

**Prof. Sarah Nolwenn Mécheneau** is a French instructor at Glendale Community College and Ph.D Candidate at Michigan State University. She comes from Nantes in France where she specialized in English and Russian history and literature. She has taught a wide range of classes from French language to French literature, French cinema and Intercultural Communication through the study of graphic novels. She specializes in 19th century studies and has also worked on graphic novels as a medium for foreign language acquisition. **Prof. Piper Rooney** has taught in the English division at Glendale Community College for ten years. She lived and studied in England and Ireland for seventeen years, and has spent many months in France, most recently delivering a paper at the WRAB conference at Universite Paris-Ouest Nanterre in 2014. **Dr. Paul J. Sherman** enjoys a varied career as a conductor, oboist and musicologist. He performs on both modern and baroque period instruments and enjoys a career with many different musical branches including jazz, classical and early music. His doctorate is in oboe performance with minors in conducting, early music and music history from USC. While there he was honored as the universities top wind graduate in 2007. Dr. Sherman has been on the faculty of USC as Instructor of Early Music and Director of the Oboe band, at Chapman University as Director of the Wind Symphony and Coordinator of winds and brass, and at College of the Canyons as Director of the Symphony of the Canyons. He is Music Director of the Santa Clarita Valley Youth Orchestra Foundation. As a performer he has appeared with the LA. Chamber Orchestra, Los Angeles Philharmonic, LA Master Choral, Santa Barbara Chamber Orchestra, Santa Barbara Opera, Southwest Chamber Music, Santa Fe Pro Musica and Music Angelica among many others. *Prof. Paul Sherman D.M.A. (818) 240-1000, x5621 / psherman@glendale.edu*

## Cultural Program

Cultural learning is an integral part of the program. Included in the program is a Seine river tour and two one-day excursions to Auvers/Giverny and the Loire Valley. Optional excursions available on the weekends during the program include a three-day/two-night excursion to Provence (\$325), as well as an optional three-day/two-night excursion to Normandy and Brittany (\$325). More information regarding optional excursions will be provided upon receipt of application. *Excursions are chosen based on the academic curriculum and are subject to change.*

### Transportation

All participants must check-in at the ACCENT Paris Center June 25, 2018, between 9am and 5pm (Note: most transatlantic flights depart one day before their arrival date). ACCENT will organize an optional round-trip group flight from Los Angeles. Airfare is not included in the program fee. Group flight participants will be met at the airport in Paris and transferred to their housing. Group flight participants returning to the U.S. on the group return date will receive transportation to the Paris airport. Airfare prices vary considerable based on availability and time of purchase. Glendale Community College and ACCENT will provide some options between December 2017 and April 2018. Please be prepared to purchase your airfare during this time period.

## Payment Schedule

The above breakdown includes the \$150 refundable security deposit. The payment schedule is the applicant's contractual obligation. Failure to make each payment when due shall automatically cancel participant from the program one week after payment due date. All payments are effective the day they are received by the ACCENT San Francisco Center. ACCENT, in its sole discretion, may reinstate an applicant subject to availability of space and late enrollment fees. ACCENT charges a \$30 bounced check fee for each check received that is not promptly paid by your bank in the normal course of business.

## GCC Tuition & Fees

Academic credit for this program is awarded by Glendale Community College. A \$46 per unit enrollment fee must be paid to GCC at the time of registration. Nonresidents of California pay \$214 per unit. Fees are set by the State of California and are subject to change. ## Student Housing

Students may choose to live in double or single rooms in residence halls at the Cité Universitaire. Housing at the Cité is student-level, may contain co-ed bathrooms and is in buildings without elevators or air conditioning. The supplement for a single room at the Cité is \$650. Single rooms in the residence halls are limited and are not guaranteed. The Cité Universitaire, an international residence campus of the University of Paris for students from around the world, is located within easy reach of central Paris by métro. The Maison Internationale on the Cité campus houses a restaurant, café, library, theater, bank and sports facilities. Housing is provided from the first day of the program (June 25, 2018).
