Courses for Prospective R.N. Students

NOTE: Effective February 1, 2019, the following policies will be adopted by the GCC Nursing Department:

- Applicants must have a minimum overall GPA of 2.5 and minimum GPA of 2.5 in Anatomy, Physiology and Microbiology.
- Applicants with a combined total of more than one (1) repeat in Anatomy, Physiology, or Microbiology will be considered ineligible. Grades of W, C-, D or F are considered repeats.
- The following perquisite courses must be completed with a letter grade of "C" or better and grades showing on the student's transcript.

*Anatomy, Physiology and Microbiology courses older than 7 years must be repeated. Students who feel they have valid reason to petition this may do so using the Petition to Waive the Science Recency form.

Method of Selection

The Chancellor's Formula is a combination of overall GPA, Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology GPA, Freshman English GPA, and any documented repetition of Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology classes. Individual student scores in each of these areas are entered into a weighted formula which evolved from a statewide study of nursing student success. Each score is weighted relative to its importance and interacts with other scores in the formula. A cut score of 75% is required to be eligible.

Also students must pass the Chancellor's Office approved Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) version 6.0 diagnostic assessment test. A cut score of 62% is required to be eligible for random selection.

Applicants must have a High School Diploma or GED or equivalent or AA/AS or higher degree and a Social Security Number (SSN) or individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) to be eligible to apply to the R.N. program.

Applicants with foreign High School Diploma, College education or degree see a nursing counselor.

Associate In Science Requirements for R.N.

For the AS in Registered Nursing, students need to complete the following general education requirements.

It is strongly recommended that students complete the AS degree requirements before applying to the R.N. program.

Note: Students who have earned a BA/BS degree (any major) from a regionally accredited college or university from the U.S. will receive an AS degree in RN when completing the prerequisites (including eligibility for Math 101), Speech 101 and the Registered Nursing program.

3. CULTURAL DIVERSITY

Three semester units in Cultural Diversity are required. Courses that satisfy this requirement have been marked by (CD) and appear throughout the graduation requirements. The requirement may be satisfied by completing any one of the graduation requirements with a course marked (CD) or by completing Child Development 156; Speech 115.

MATHEMATICS

Satisfactory evidence of proficiency in mathematics must be given. Proficiency may be demonstrated by completion with a grade of "C" or better in Mathematics 30, 30+, 90, 90+, 101, 118, 120 or 220AB (2 units), 130, 131.
