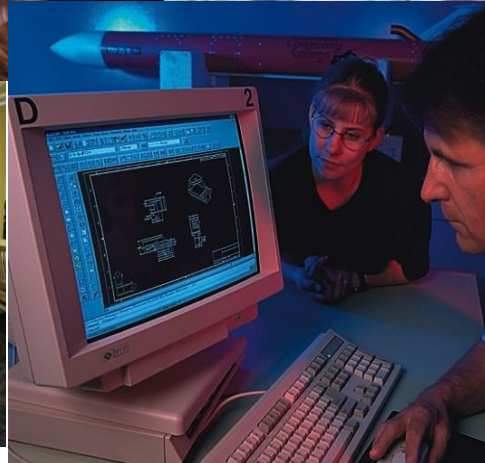

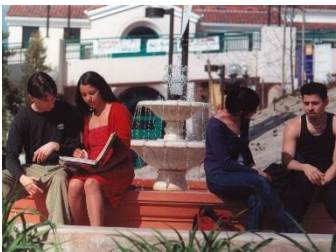

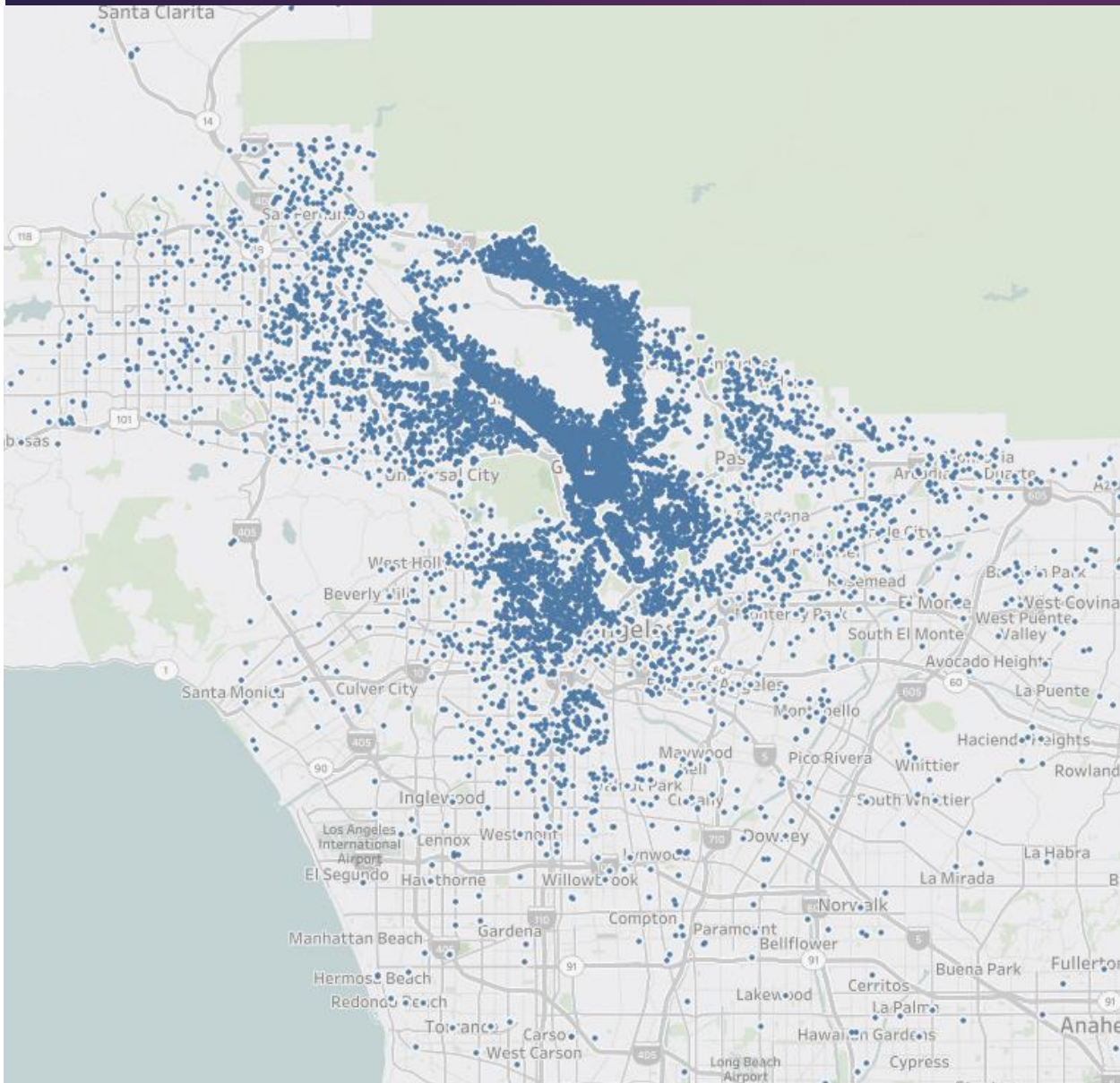
Vision

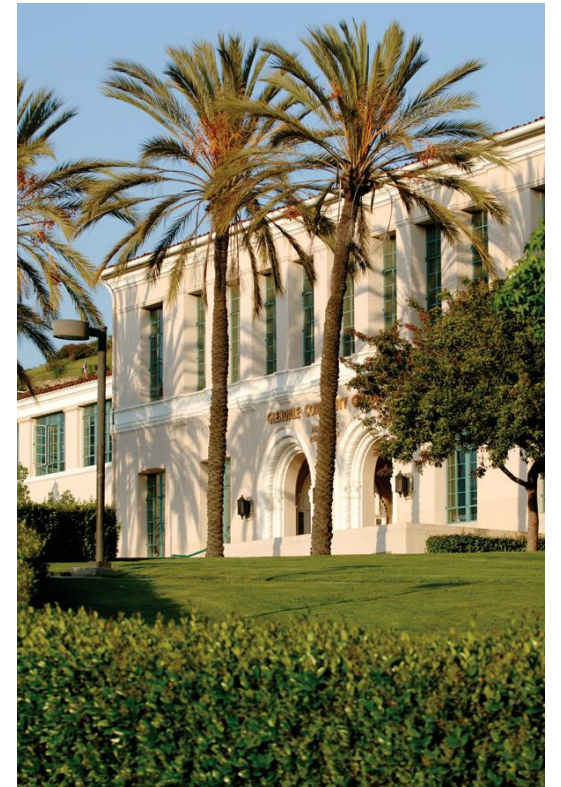

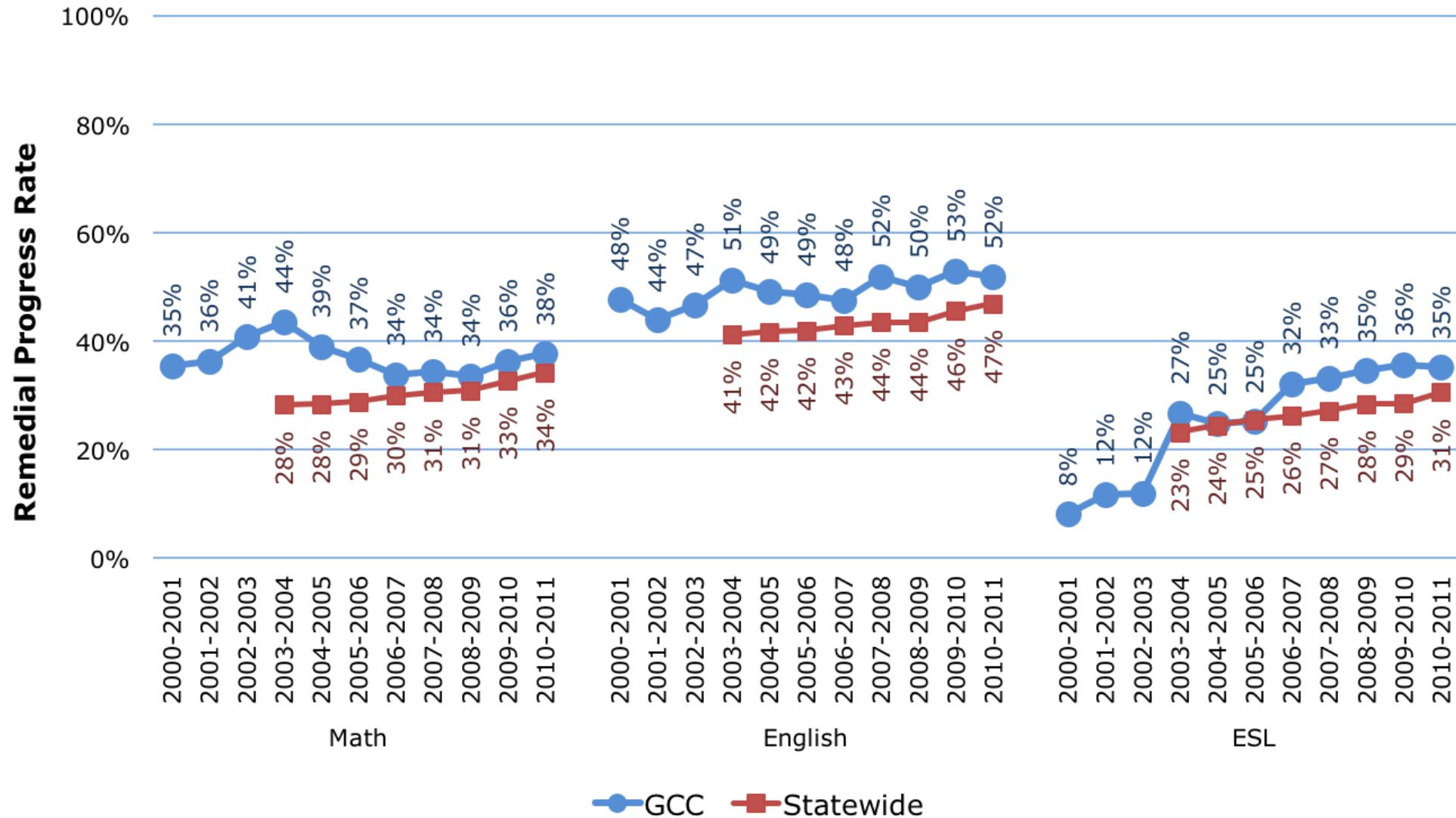

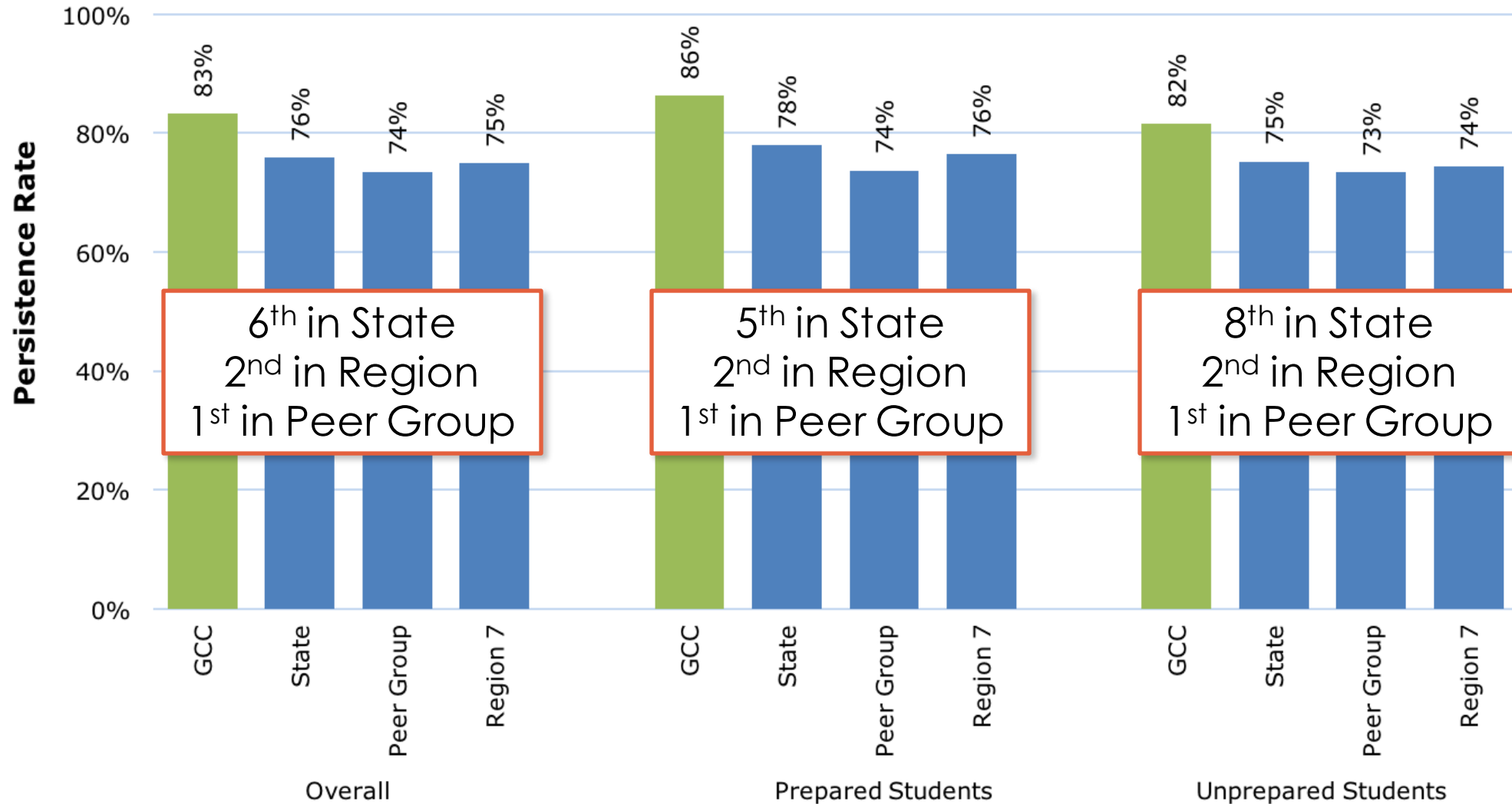
Remedial / ESL Metrics: 2010-11 Cohort



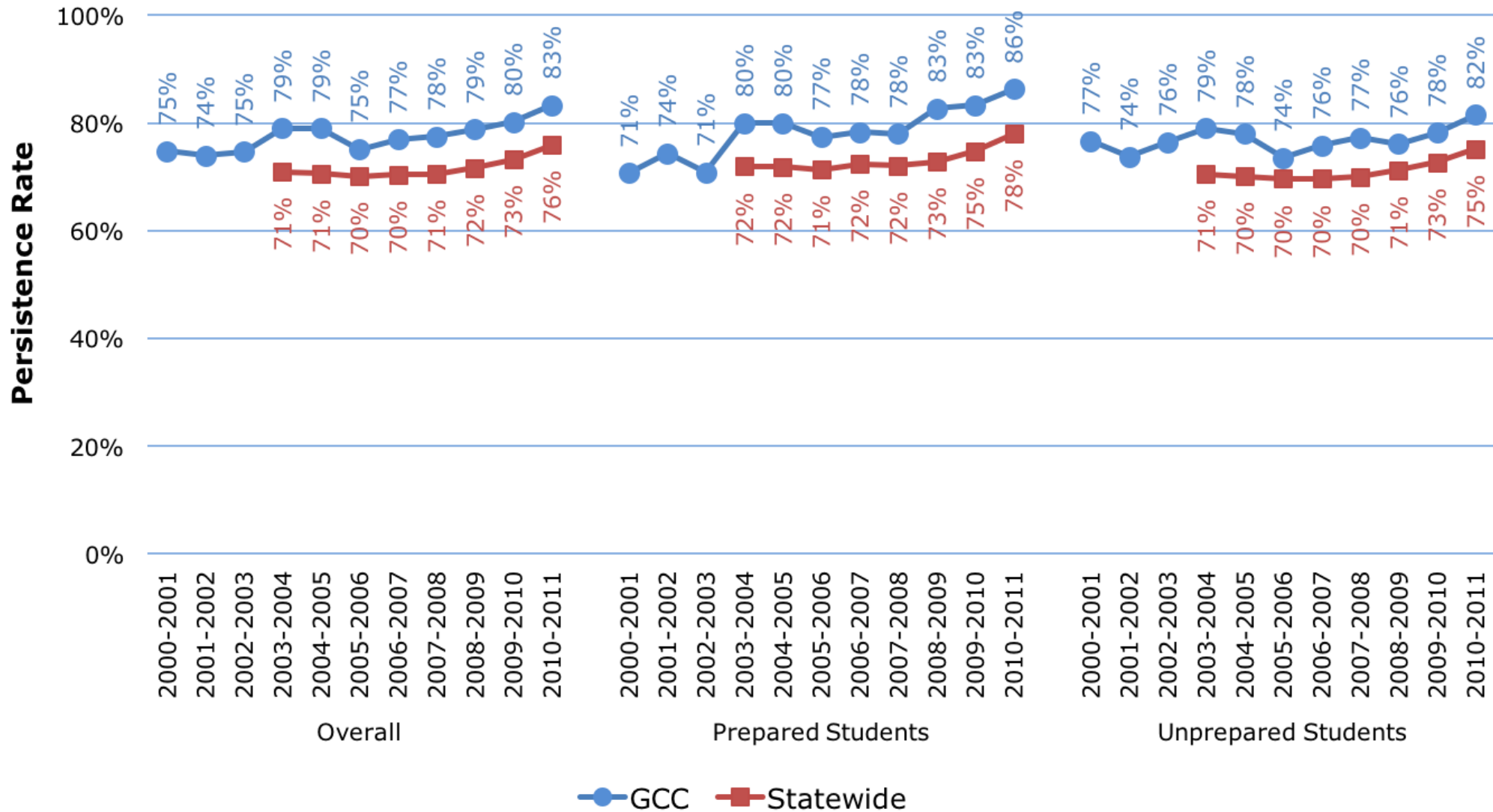
Remedial / ESL Metrics: Trends



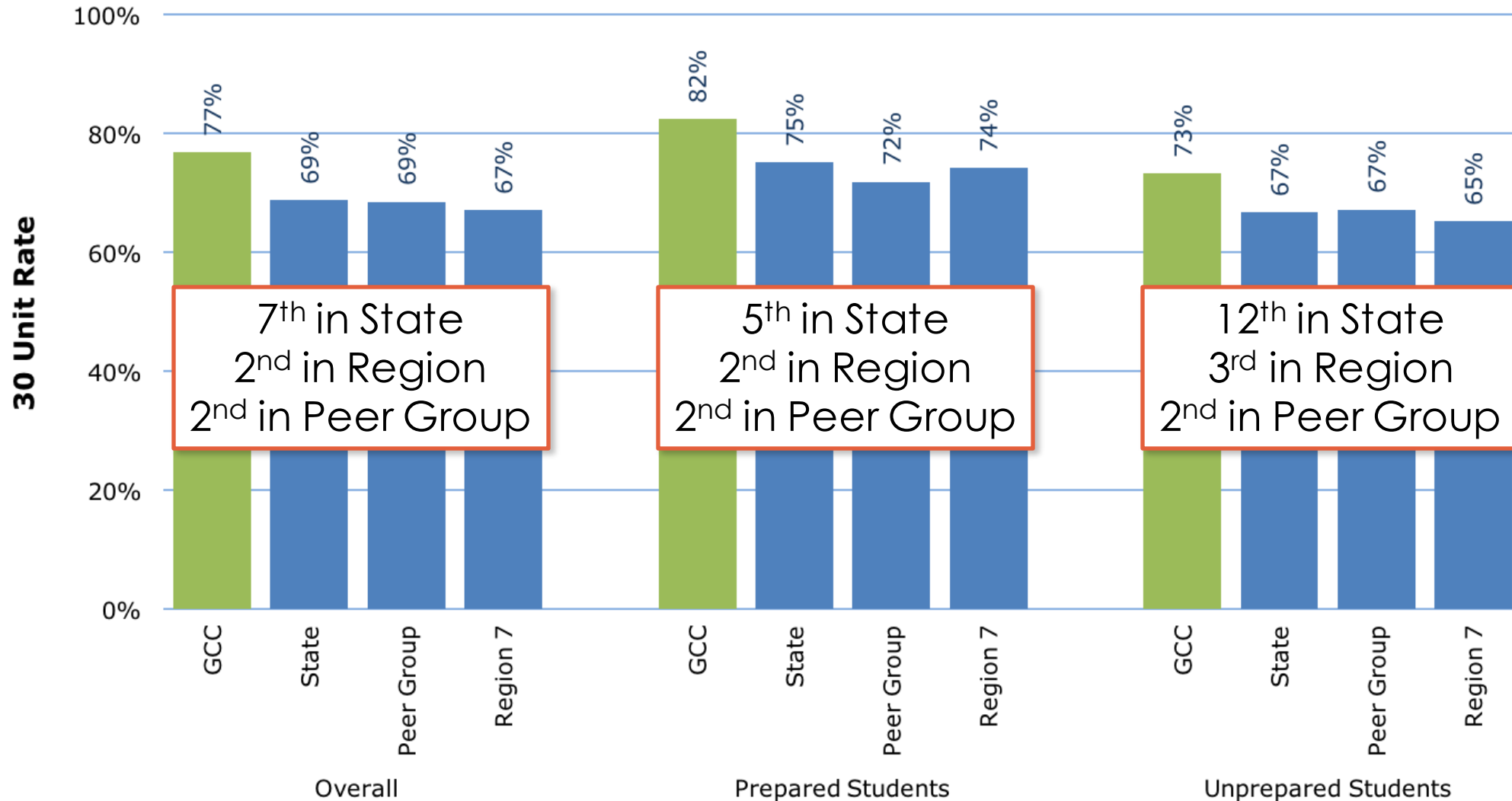
Persistence Rate: 2010-11 Cohort



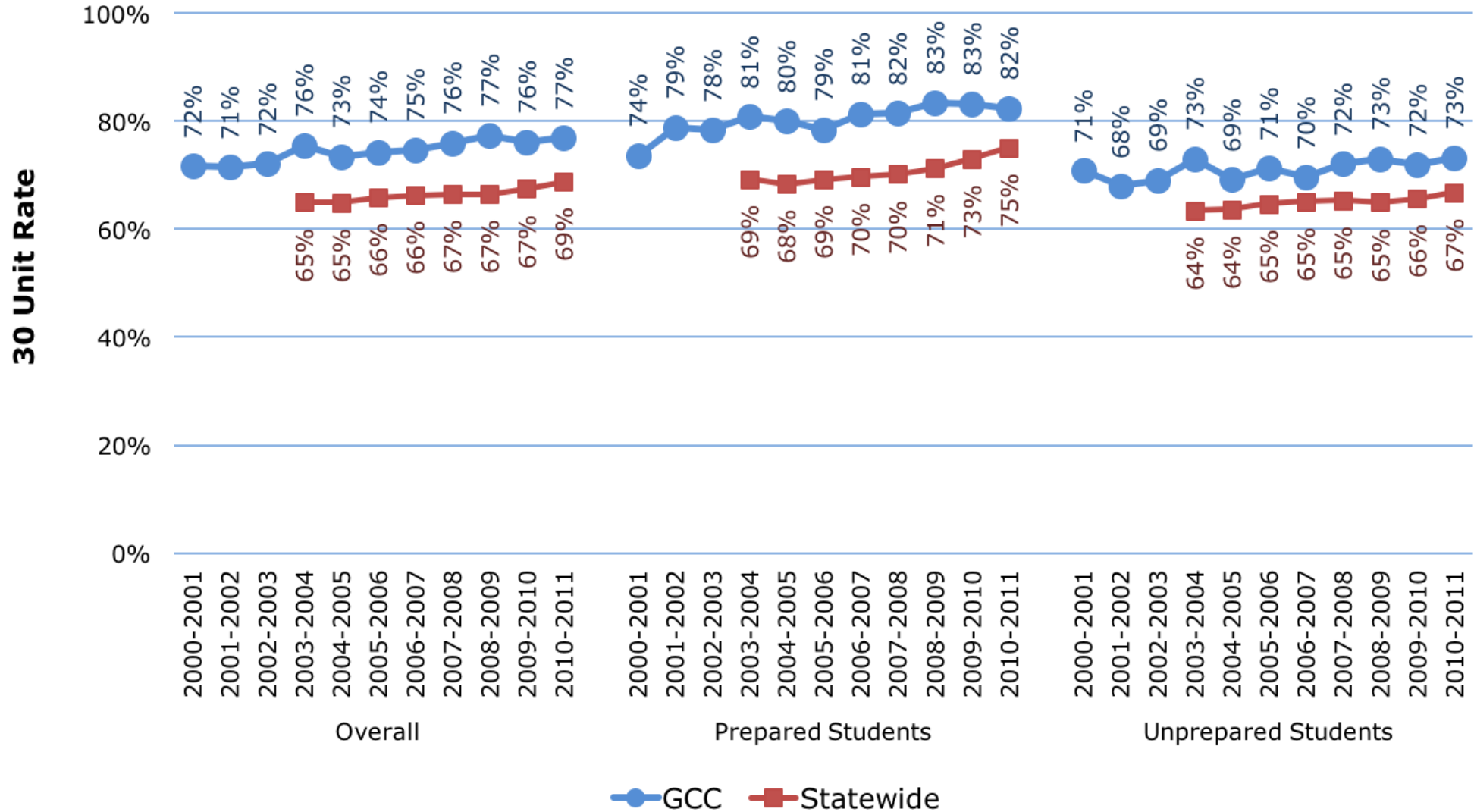
Persistence Rate: Trends



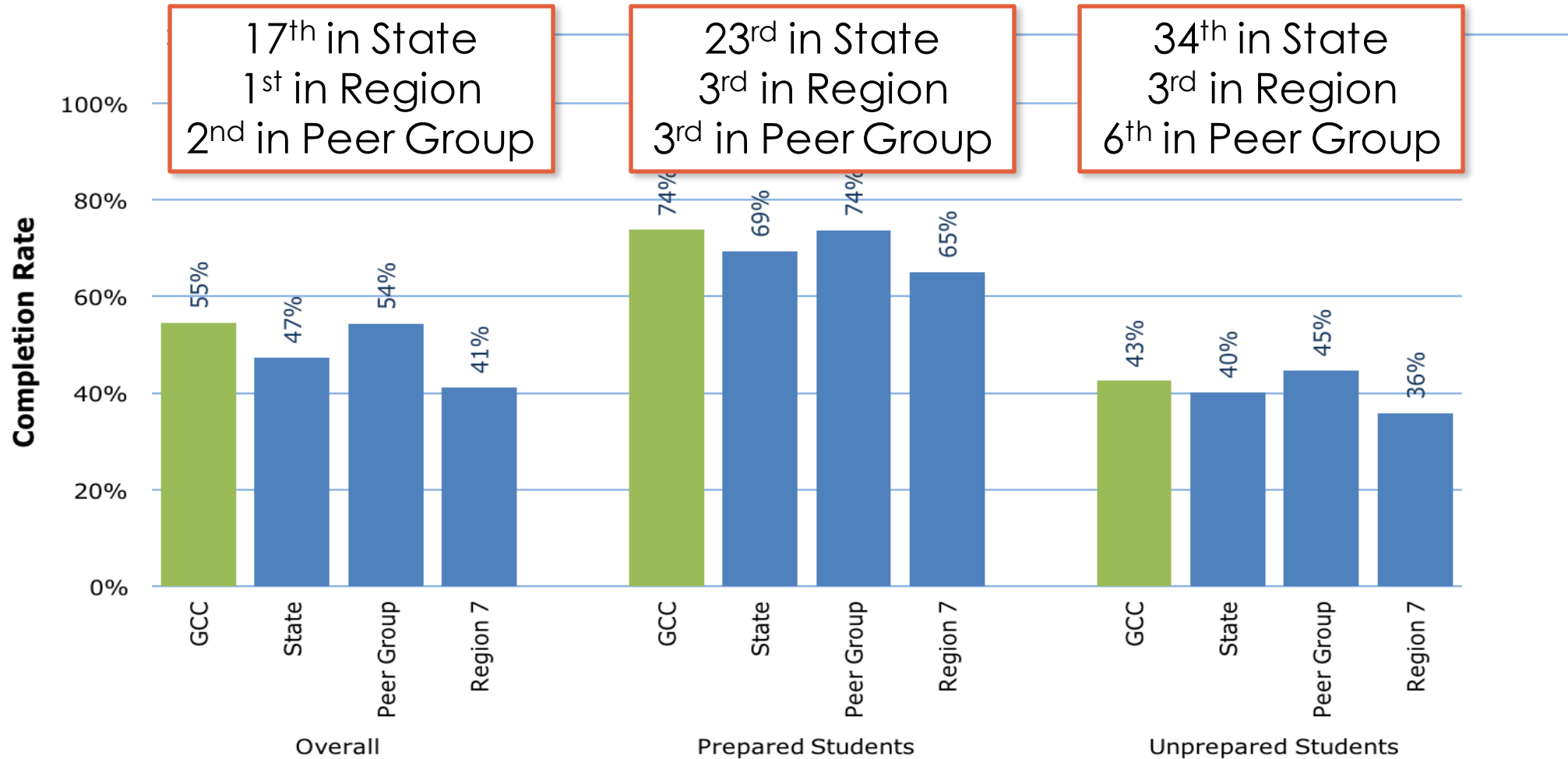
30 Unit Rate: 2010-11 Cohort



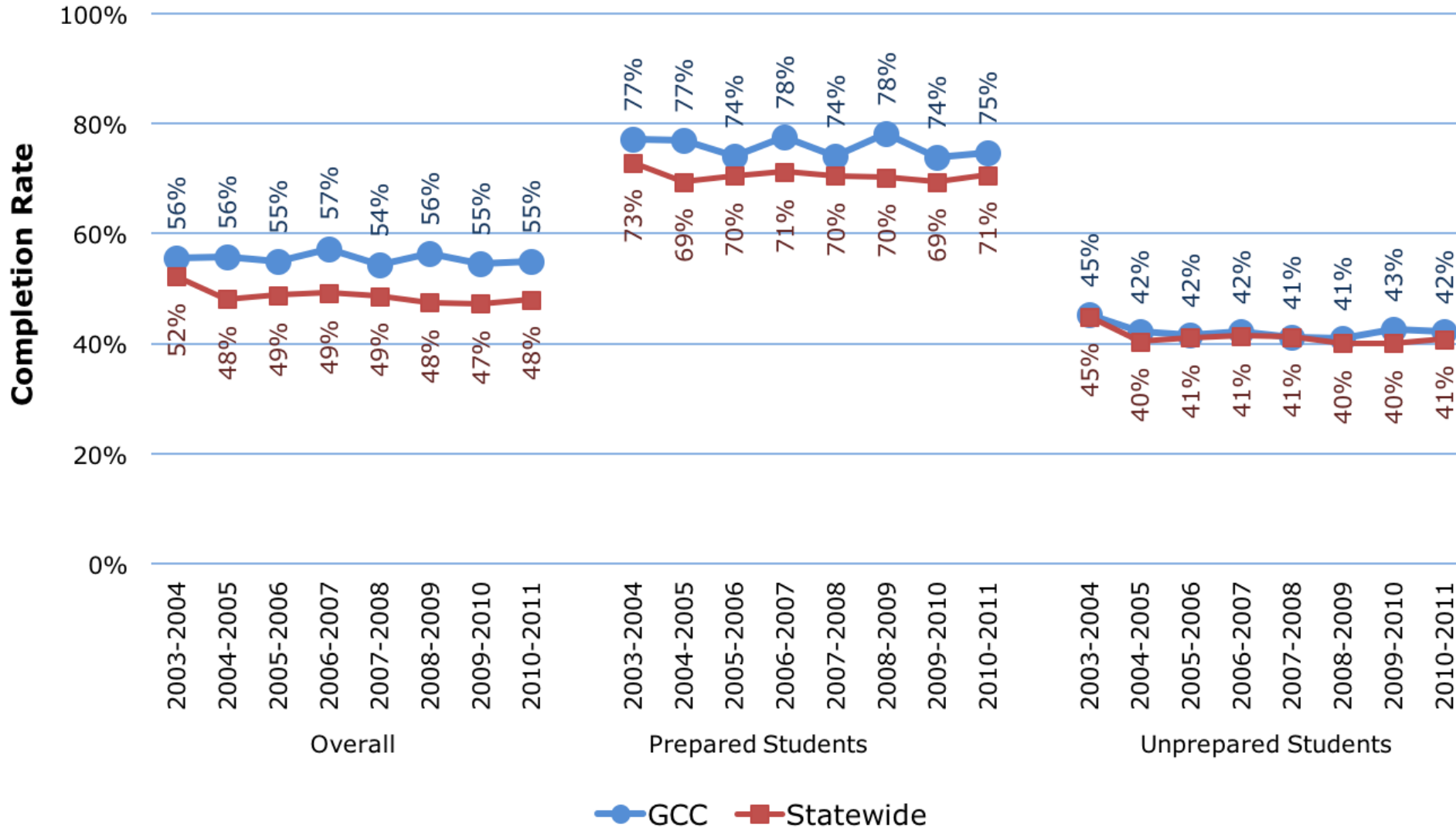
30 Unit Rate: Trends



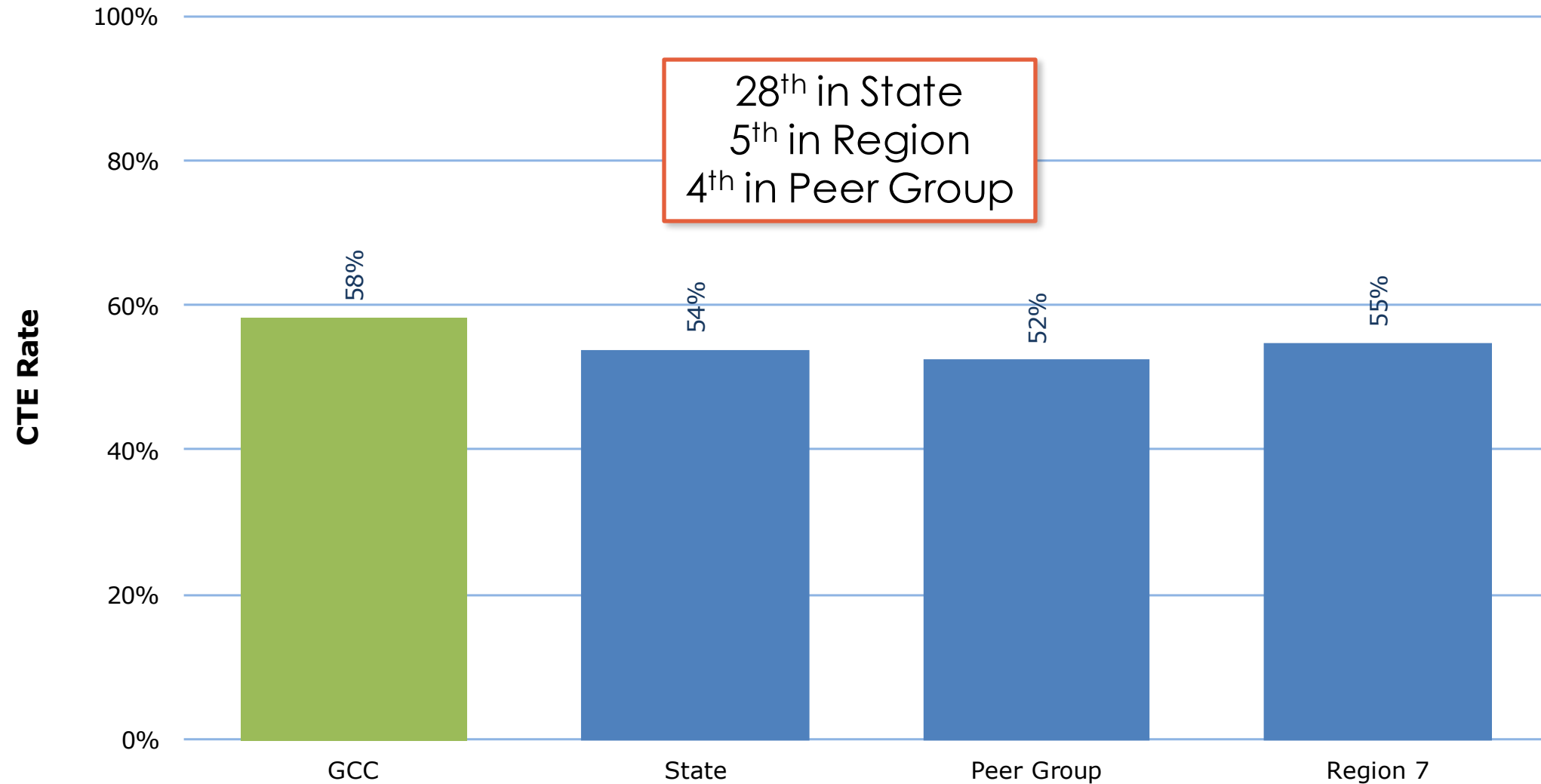
Completion Rate: 2010-11 Cohort



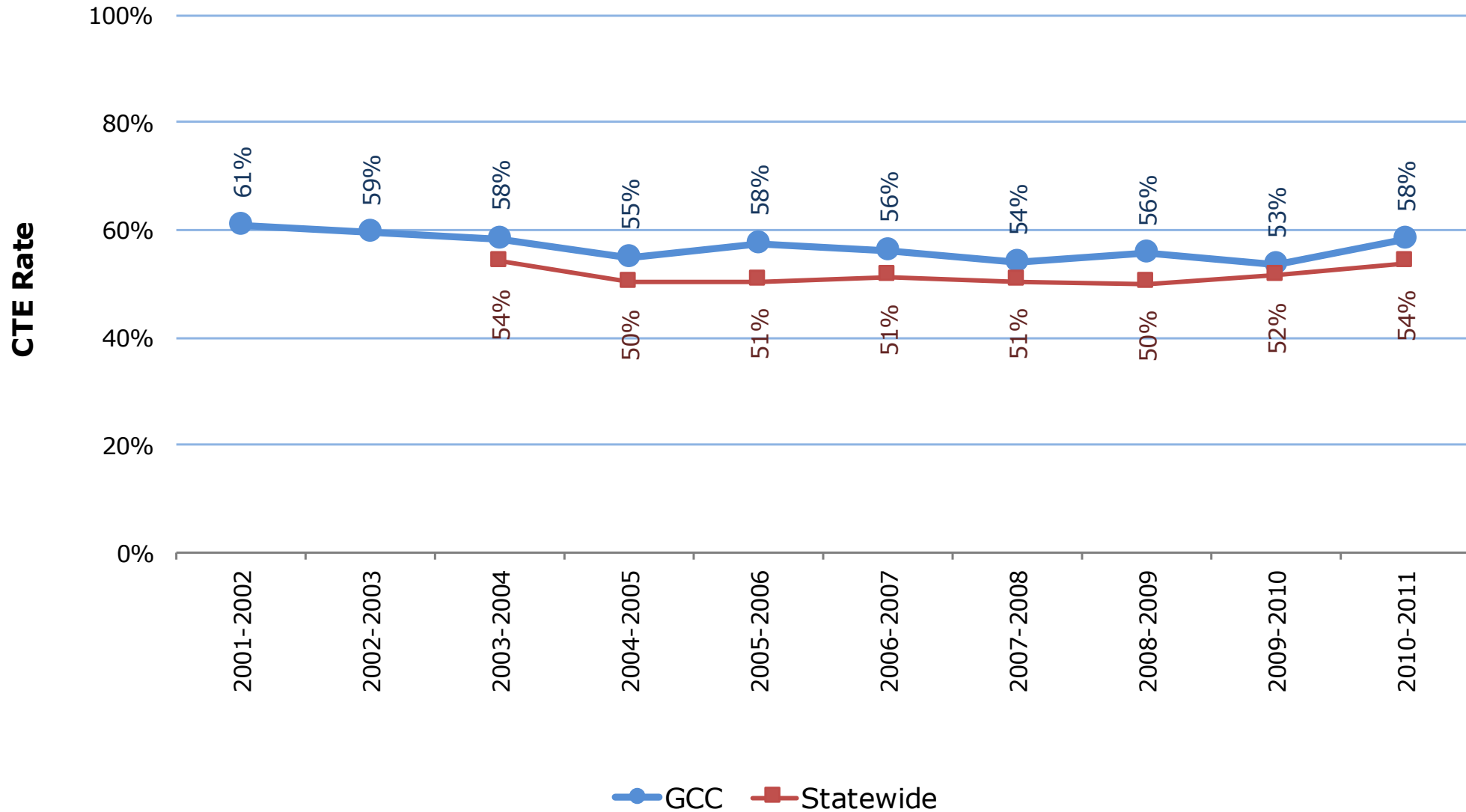
Completion Rate: Trends



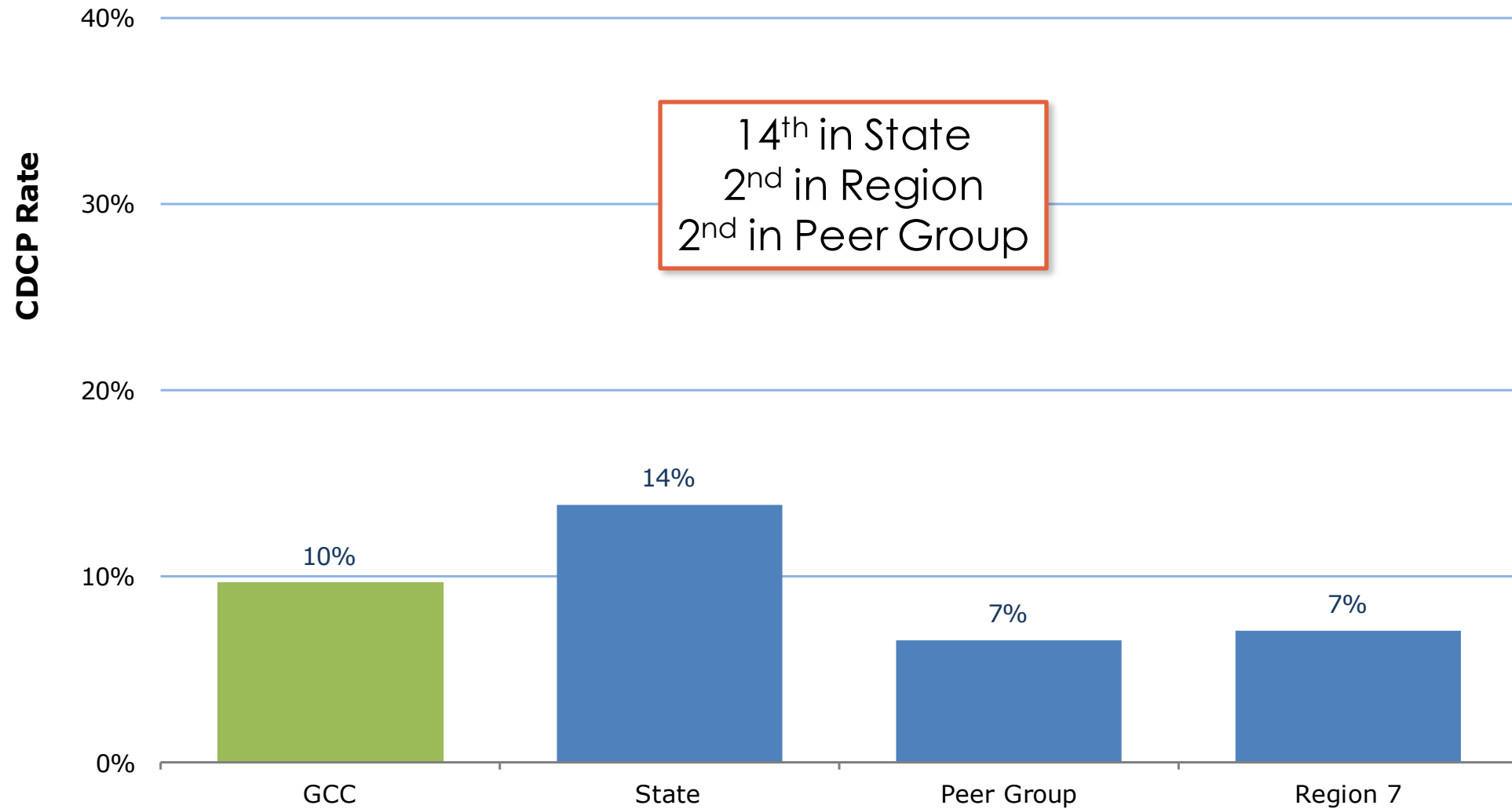
CTE Rate: 2010-11 Cohort



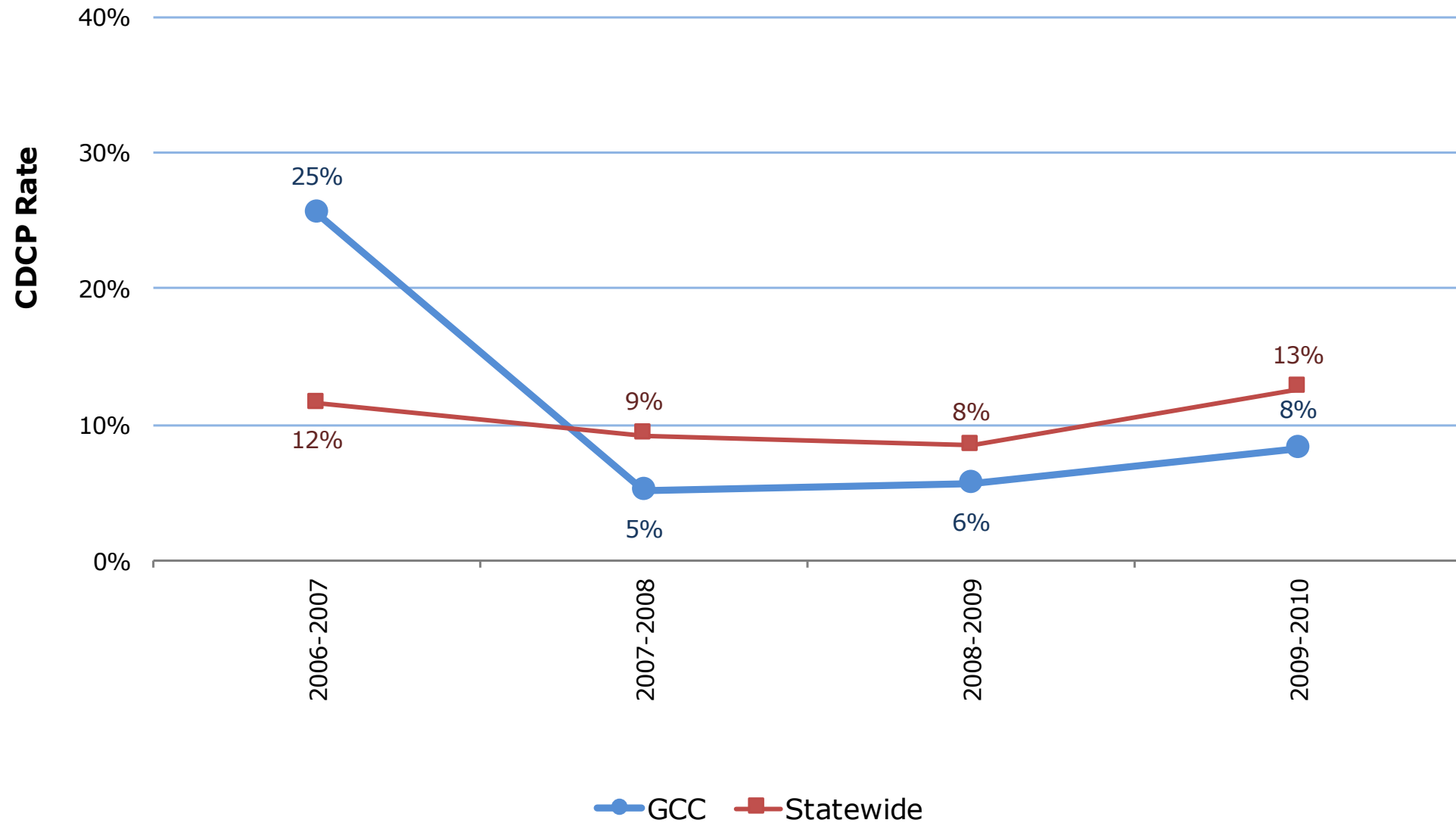
CTE Rate: Trends



CDCP Rate: 2010-2011 Cohort



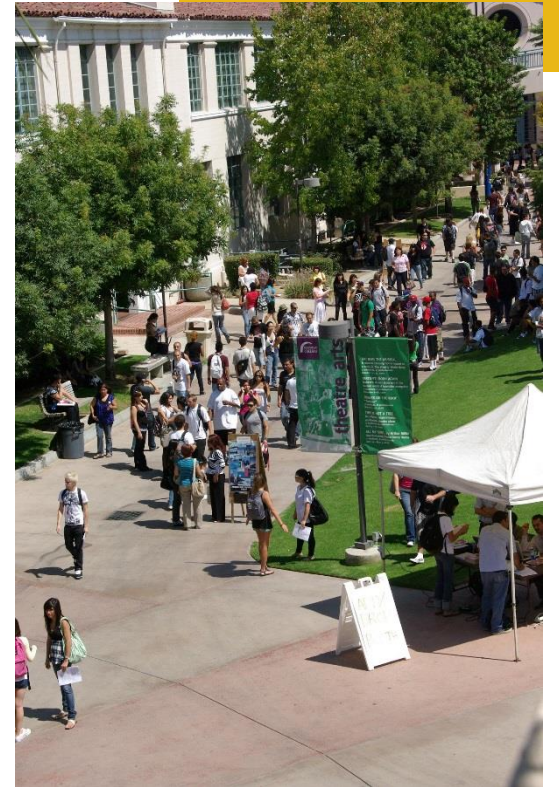

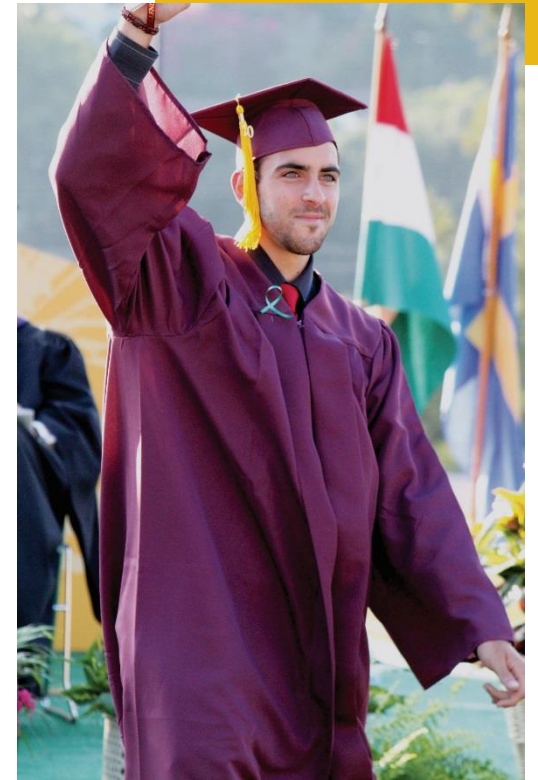

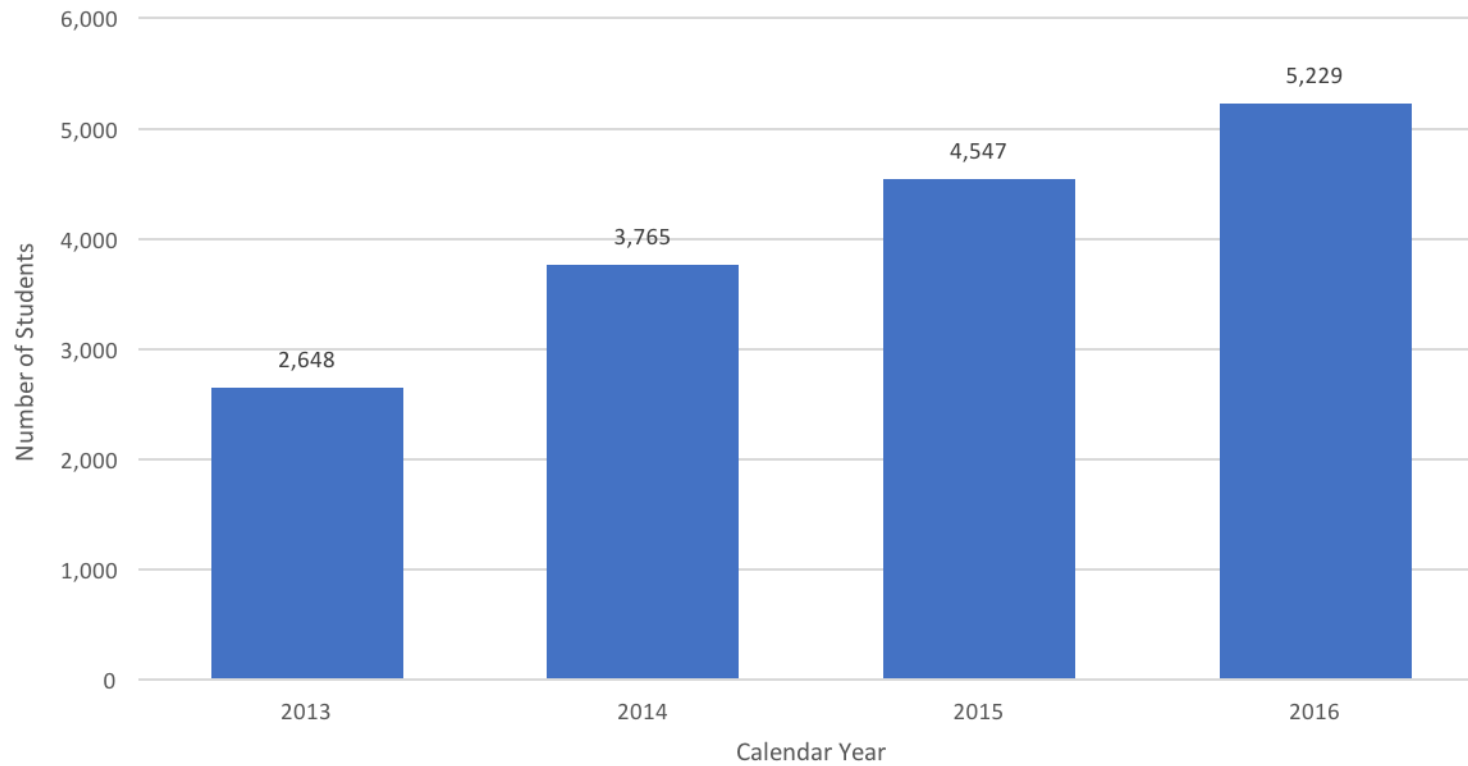
All Students Achieve – Closing the Gaps



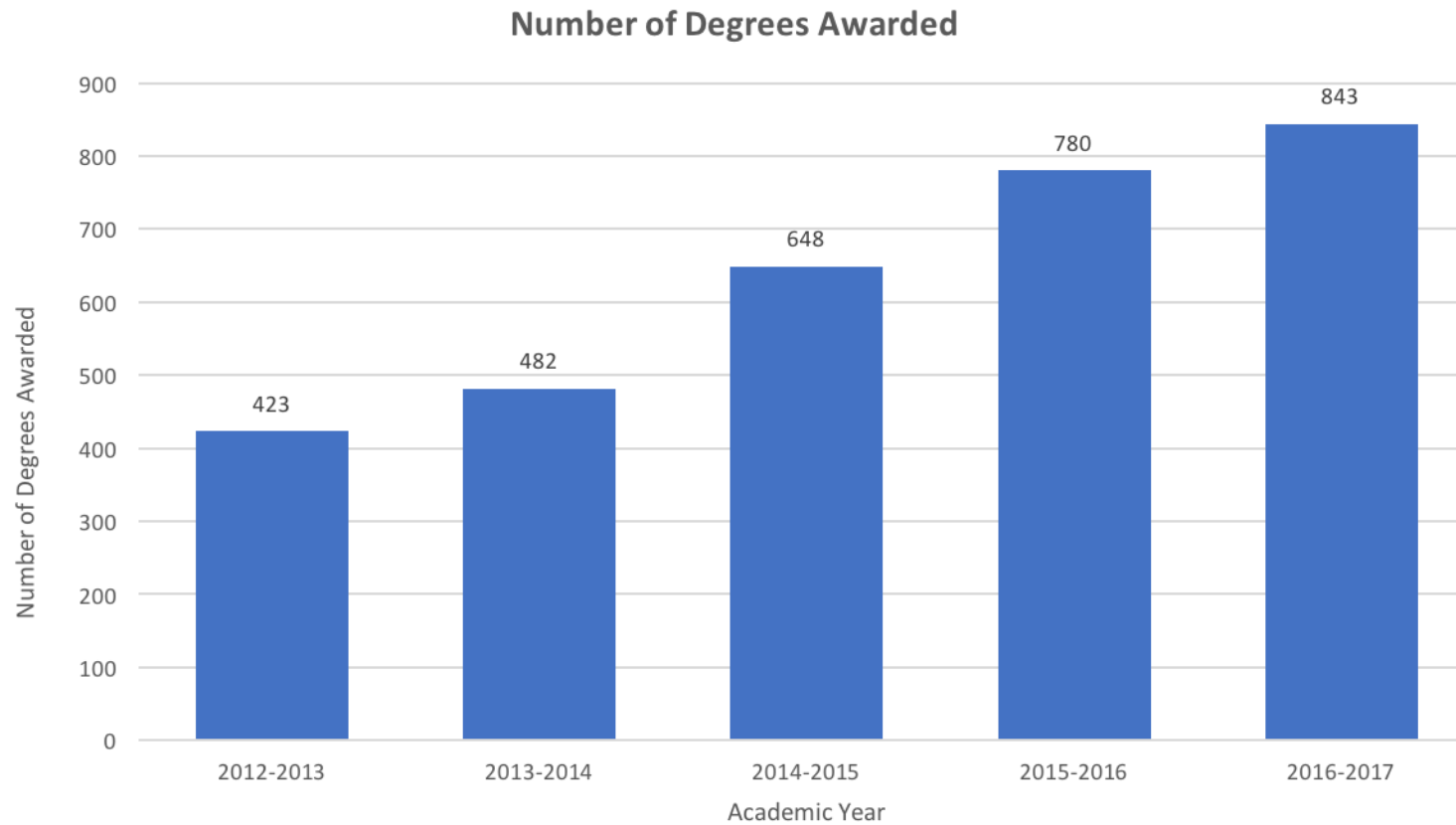
- ▶ Latino course completion rate remained at 10% below GCC average
- ▶ African-American course completion rate 13% below GCC average – up from 15% below average
- ▶ Veterans completion rate matched the GCC average – up from 13% below average

Number of Students with SEP

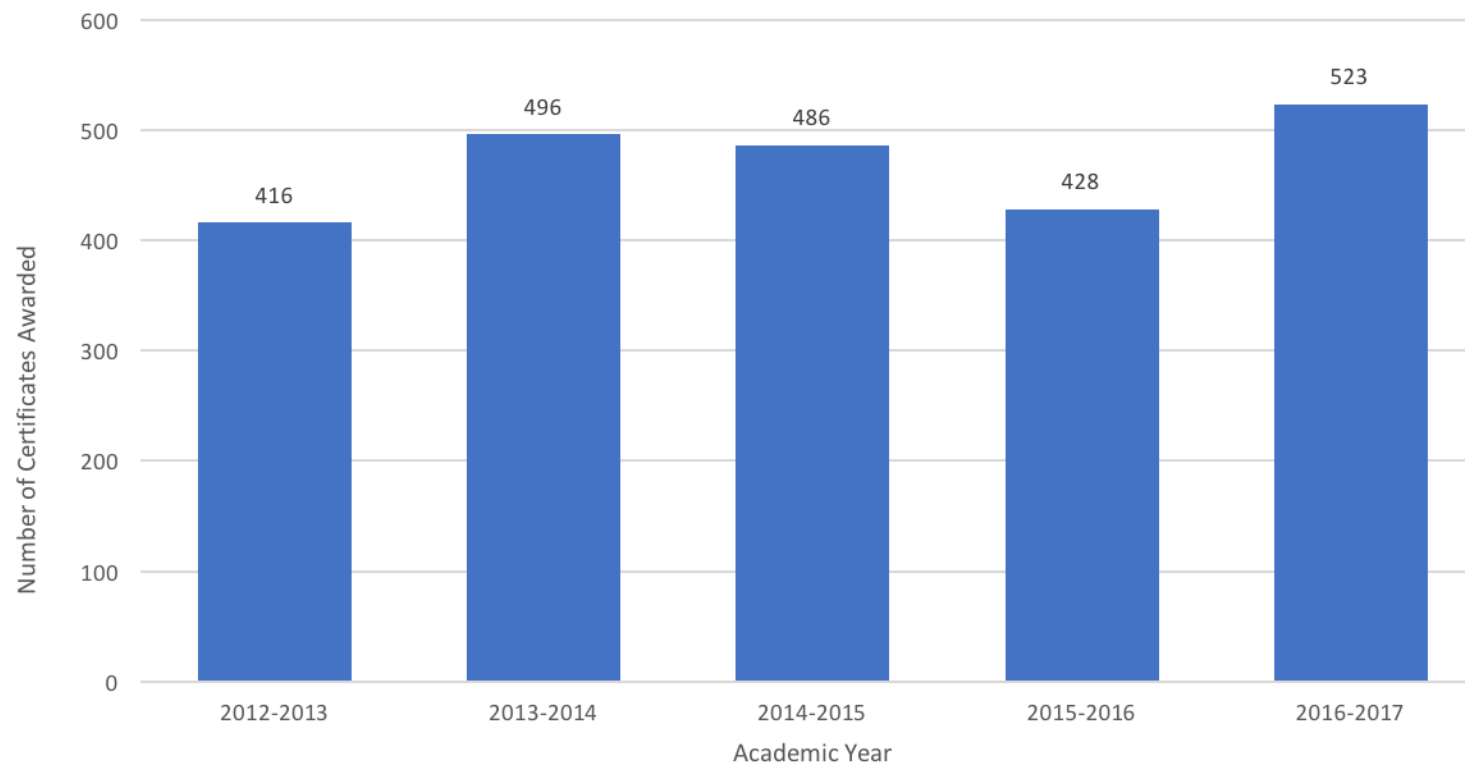


Number of Degrees Awarded



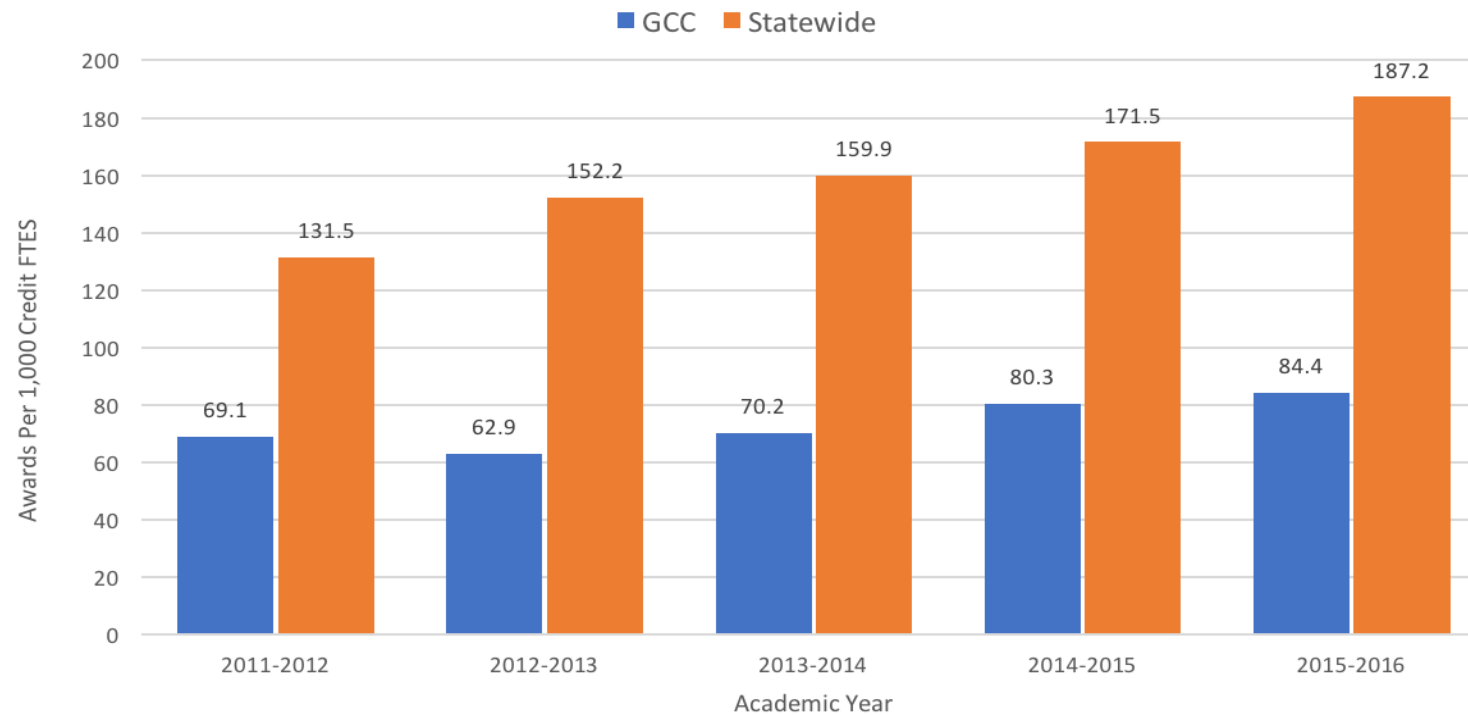
Number of Certificates Awarded

Number of Credit and Noncredit Certificates Awarded

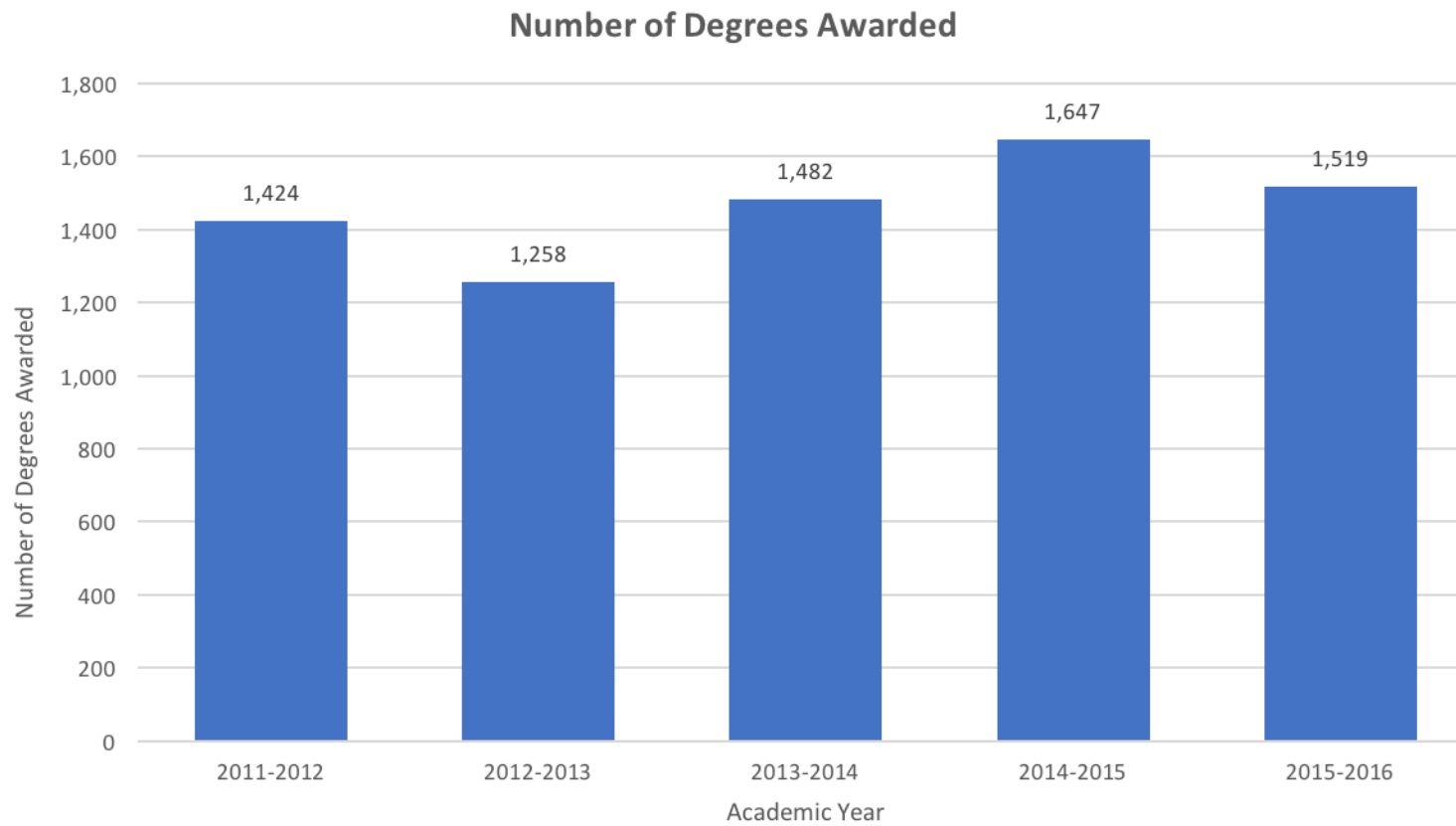


Degrees and Certificates Awarded Per 1,000 FTES

Number of Credit Degrees and Certificates Awarded Per 1,000 Credit FTES

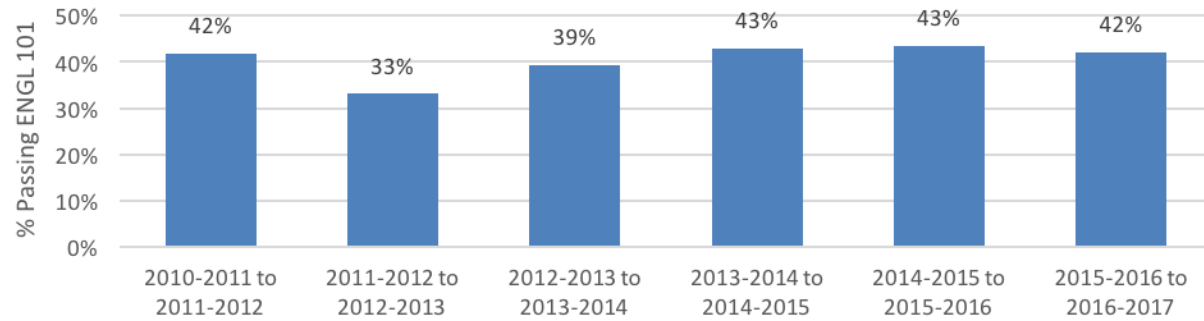

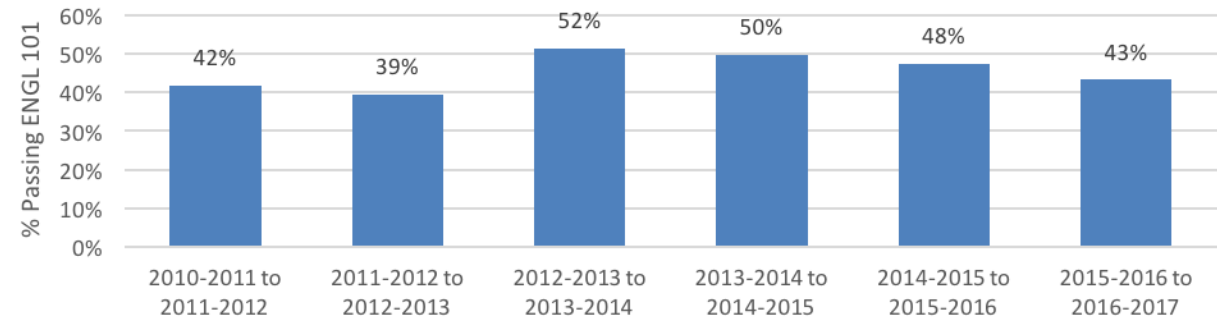


Short-Term Basic Skills Progress

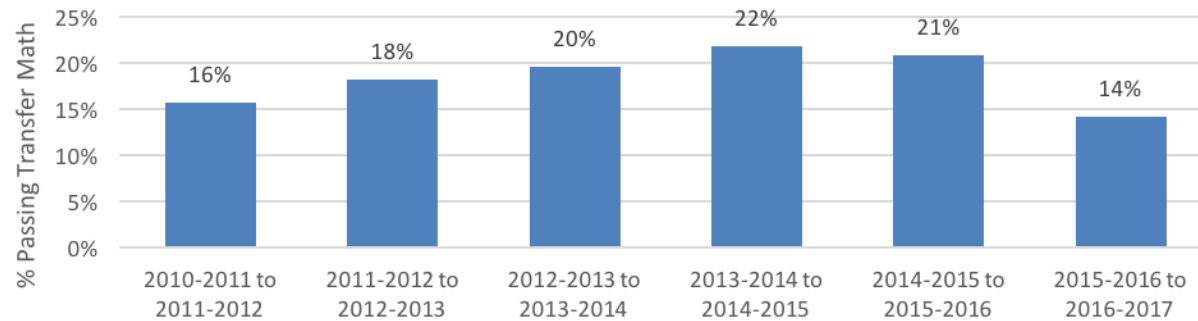
ENGL 191 Students Who Passed ENGL 101 Within Two Years



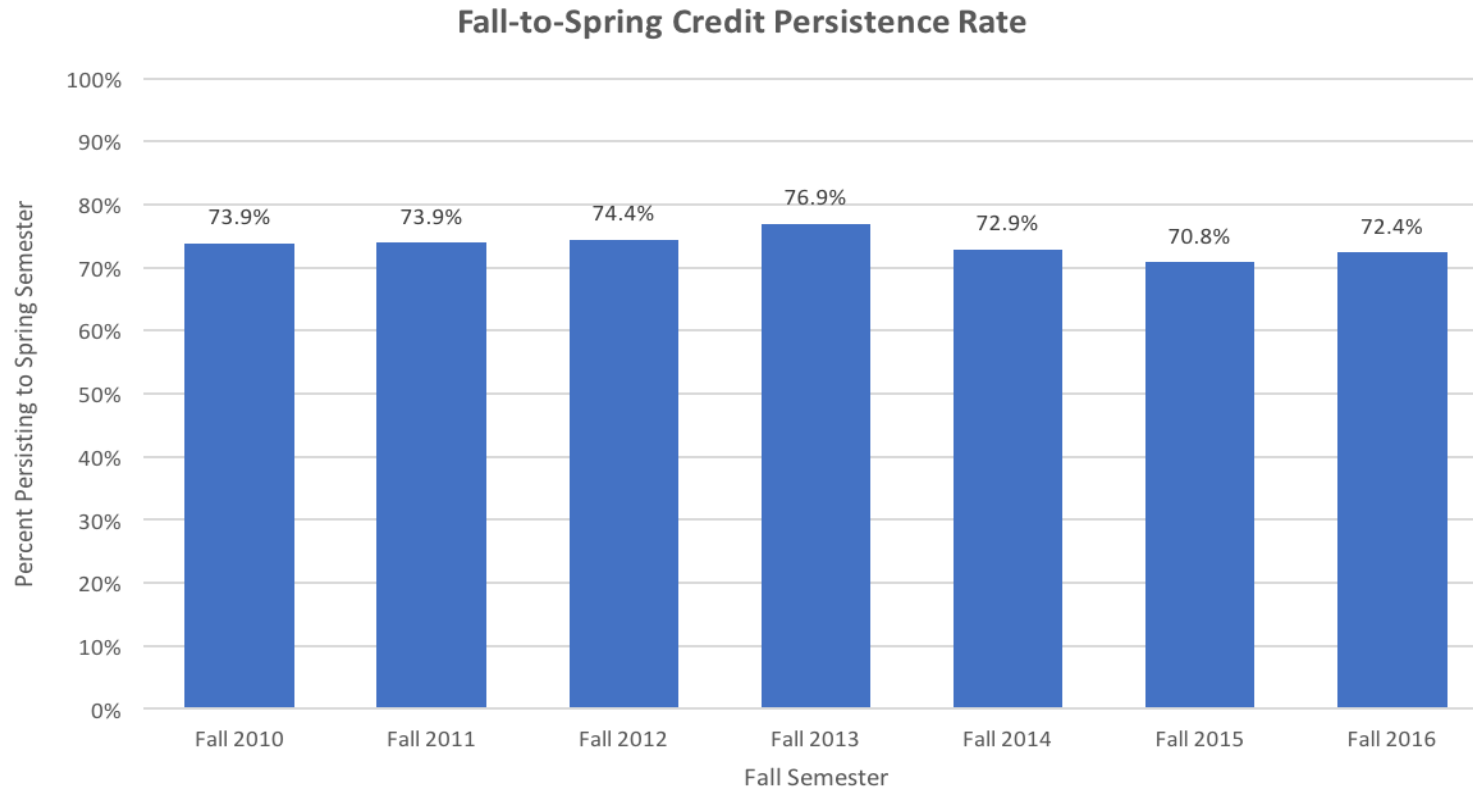
ESL 141 Students Who Passed ENGL 101



Beginning Algebra Students Who Passed Transfer Math

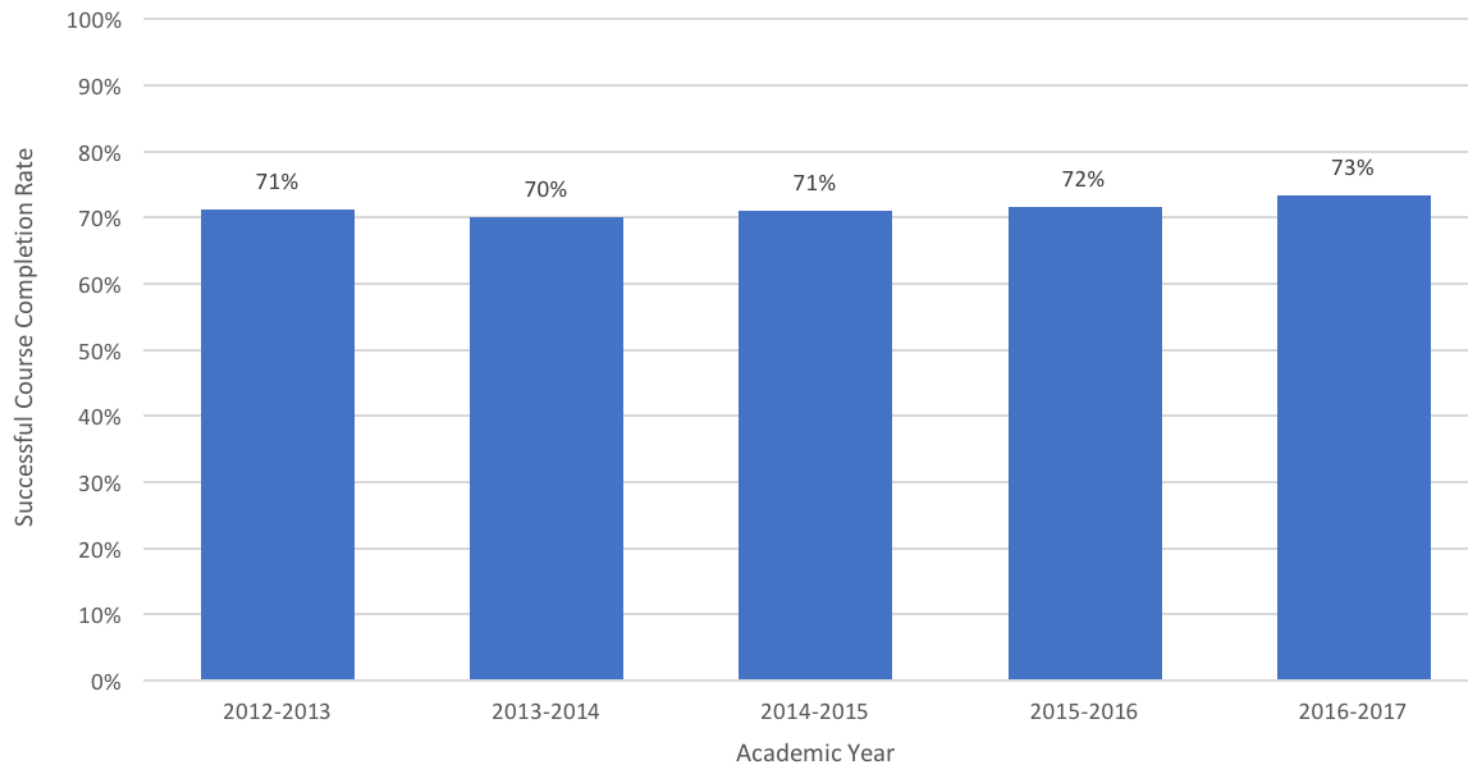


Fall-to-Spring Persistence Rate Trend
