

Articulation Explained *for* Students & Parents

WHAT IS ARTICULATION?

Articulation is an agreement between two campuses. When a high school course is articulated with a college course, it means that the students who pass the high school class will be able to earn college credits for that course.

To earn college credit, a student must complete a full year of the high school course and earn a “B” or better in both semesters.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF ARTICULATION?

- High school students **earn college credit** while in high school
- High school students **save time** by earning Glendale Community College credits
- High school students **save money** by earning free Glendale Community College credits
- High school students **increase and expand their knowledge** of college and career readiness

HOW DO I ENROLL IN AN ARTICULATED CLASS?

- High school students inform their high school counselor of their interest
- The high school counselor/career technical education instructors will assist student through completion of the required paperwork

WHAT IS THE COST OF ARTICULATION?

- There are no costs to take a class while in high school.

DOES ARTICULATED CREDIT TRANSFER TO OTHER COLLEGES OR UNIVERSITIES?

- Articulation credit is intended to be used toward the attainment of a degree or certificate at Glendale Community College. However, depending on the other higher education institution’s policy, it may be used as transfer credit. Check with the other institution about acceptance of articulated high school course credit.

WHICH GLENDALE COMMUNITY COLLEGE COURSES QUALIFY FOR CREDIT?

PROCESS FOR RECEIVING CREDIT IN ARTICULATED CLASSES AT GCC:

- High school students must apply for enrollment at GCC and Register for Career and Technical Education Management Application (CATEMA).
- CATEMA registration and completion of GCC’s application are required from high school students seeking college credit.

*Note Credit by Exam will be required for GCC Culinary Articulation Agreements courses. Students do not need to apply for CATEMA during high school. After high school, Student meets with the department chair or faculty designee for further instructions for Credit by Examination.
