<p>State of California Department of Insurance</p>	<p>Provides information regarding insurance issues.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Answer general insurance inquires. • Review insurance documents. • Aid with insurer disputes and handling delays. • Assist displaced survivors with continuation of additional living expense benefits for inaccessible/uninhabitable homes. • Assists property owners locating the insurance policy for the property.
<p>State of California Department of Motor Vehicles</p>	<p>Responds to questions and provides forms needed to assist individuals in replacing DMV documents.</p> <p>Vouchers available for local office to assist with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Driver license and Identification card replacement • Duplicate titles • Duplicate vehicle registration card • Information on Real ID • Proper identification/marketing of wildfire destroyed vehicles.
<p>State of California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides disaster relief to taxpayers, fee payers, and business owners who live in or own businesses. • Survivors may be eligible to receive free replacement copies of tax records and extensions on filing tax returns.
