

Completion of Cal-GETC will permit a student to transfer from a California Community College (CCC) to a California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) campus or program without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements.

Although it is strongly recommended that students complete Cal-GETC prior to transfer, completion of Cal-GETC may not be appropriate for some engineering, math, science, or other high unit majors. Some individual colleges or majors within a UC campus may not accept or recommend Cal-GETC to fulfill all of their general education requirements. See a counselor to discuss the best path for you.

**All courses must be completed with grades of "C" or better. Courses appearing in more than one area may be used to satisfy only one area. The (^) notation indicates that transfer credit may be limited by UC. See a counselor for details.**
