## **XIII. Reports of Governance/Special Committee Meetings**

### **1. Safety Committee - Amy Novshadyan / Mia Marekhashvili**

- Discussed accidents that have happened on campus, for example, a snake bit someone.
- Welfare checks are done if someone is unresponsive or in the bathroom for too long. There have been around 30 elevator emergencies.
- There will be stricter enforcement in the parking lot due to safety issues.
- For COVID, policies will stay the same, which are set by LA Public Health. However, there have been fewer cases lately.
- Emergency Incident Coordination is ongoing between HR and a few other departments.
- A question about cameras in the parking lot was brought up, and nothing was said about that during the meeting. However, they will be promoting parking and driving safety.
- Governance members were asked to bring up the issue of DSPS parking spots being misused.
- If your car has been hit, you should call the campus police at their extension to get help.

### **2. EEO Committee - Ryan Avakian / Mia Marekhashvili**

- The district is committed to hiring diverse employees who will emphasize the importance of students.
- The goal is to make sure every candidate has a fair opportunity to be employed. Hiring is based on skills and department needs. All hiring committees are set to be as fair as possible.
- Students are encouraged to communicate with all employees and state their opinions to the staff. Students may receive an email asking their opinion on professors.
- AR7121 is a new hire insurance awareness. Professors get better insurance but are never told that they can switch with no cost. HR should have better communication so employees can know all of their benefits.
- HR provides identity verification to ensure all legality and fairness, and to exclude possibilities of fraud.

### **4. Library and Information Competency - Natalie Grigoryan / Alec Sarkissian**

- The e-book platform called Libby, for a 3-year trial, is to be launched in 2026. OneSearch will be more user-friendly.
- LIB100 is a late start class, which is a more project-oriented class, and teaches how to be more wary of the internet.
- Some announcements included the new Political Science class, POLSCI 111, and the promotion of Native American Heritage, which will be put on display in the library.
- The GCC library is working on purchasing all textbooks that are being used, including the e-book versions. Instructors are encouraged to work with the library to get the books purchased.

### **5. Curriculum and Instruction - Garo Kahwajian/ Pateel Haytayan**

- A new statewide system to organize curriculum and scheduling. We're switching from Illumin to CourseDoc, which will be a lot more student-friendly and user-friendly.
- A full data transfer will be in January; after that, every entry will be manually input.
- Faculty overload, funds, and other resources will help ease the process.
- For health, all local wellness requirements were reviewed, and it is a requirement.
- Instructors can collaborate with librarians to help structure the class, especially with the textbooks used.
- Training for faculty will begin in the Spring semester.
